Community of Practice Members Survey

Regular member surveys are key to give your Community of Practice an accurate profile of your membership, as well as their views on your services and activities. You will gain insight into your members' levels of satisfaction with your current services and find out what they want in the future.

- 1. Name/Surname this can also be asked at the end, for those who want to volunteer
- 2. Languages
- 3. Location

Expertise and interests

- Which areas do you currently work on and/or plan to work on in the next 12/18 months?
- 2. What are your top 3 areas of expertise?
- 3. Please indicate your years of experience in the domain? this can help to match people for help/support and also to identify most experienced ones
 - Below 2
 - 3 to 5
 - 5 to 10
 - 11 to 20
 - 20+
- 4. In which of the following areas do you feel you need immediate knowledge/expertise? multiple choice on Community of Practice focus areas
- 5. Top 3 challenges faced during project design/implementation that you think this CoP could help you with? open ended

 - Other
- 3. How much time do you plan to devote to the community? could be in percentages or hours per week
 - 5%
 - 10%
 - 15%
- 4. Are there any colleagues that you think we should invite to join this community of practice?
- 5. If interested in participating actively in the Community of Practice or in volunteering for any of our activities, please provide name and email address.
- 6. Do you have additional comments or suggestions?
