Report: Pathways for Peace

World Bank; United Nations

This forthcoming report, the first joint United Nations – World Bank study, explains how development programs and policymakers can better prevent violent conflict. Such steps include increasing access to power, opportunity, and security; and to be more inclusive of civil society, the private sector, and regional and international organizations. There must also be an emphasis on the meaningful participation of women and youth in decision making. This report is especially relevant to CDD, as its places a focus on inclusion and opportunity for marginalized groups and increased local participation in deve

opportunity for marginalized groups and increased local participation in development processes.

Brown-Bag Lunch: Program-for-Results (PforR) Financing

December 11

The CDD Secretariat hosted an engaging discussion on the merits of utilizing the Program-for-Results (PforR) financing instrument for a CDD project. PforR was introduced at the World Bank in 2012 as an opportunity to both foster institutional capacity building and to put an emphasis on results-focused projects s in large country programs. PforR operations directly link Bank disbursements to intended results, and support clients in enhancing effectiveness of development programs. We heard from Imad Saleh, Operations Adviser at OPCS and PforR team leader, as well as Mohamed Medouar, TTL of the Morocco National initiative for Human Development Phase 2 (INDH2), the first PforR operation at the World Bank. They discussed the importance of working inside already-existing government program structure and the opportunities and challenges of partnering with decentralized government structures.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS

FY 18 Focus Area: CDD & FCV

Two billion people live in countries where development outcomes are affected by Fragility, Conflict, and Violence (FCV) — and both low- and middle-income countries are affected by FCV risks. While FCV contexts present profound challenges to development intervention, CDD programs have been viewed as effective in these situations. CDD programs can provide flexibility to respond to the scale and nature of community needs in diverse local conditions, and also work to promote fair resource distribution, inclusion of vulnerable populations, and increased access to basic services. The CDD CoP is therefore working to support the IDA18 scale up, especially in light of an IEG review documenting the value of CDD approaches in fragile states by expanding our knowledge base of what works in these environments. Nik is taking the lead our engagement in this area, so feel free to drop him a line. For more information, read the brief on CDD and FCV.
