Local- and community-driven development (LCDD) has emerged over the past 20 years in response to the advent of integrated rural development and difficulties with centralized service delivery. LCDD approaches generally have better outcome ratings than centralized approaches and deliver more sustainable infrastructure at lower costs. LCDD has also greatly enhanced government capacities to implement programs at scale. The most successful of these programs are embedded in decentralized government structures and involve a variety of stakeholders. This brief series is on scaling up in agriculture, rural development and nutrition.

#### "Social Audits in Nepal's Community Schools: Measuring Policy Against Practice"

Nepal's publicly funded schools have been managed by community level stakeholders since it first became a democratic country in 1950. Shifts in legislation and policy have now further devolved the management of schools to the community, including financial resources to support decision-making of school level committees. Coupled with these reforms, social audits are now required to be conducted in each community school annually. Community School National Network (CSNN), a Nepali NGO in Nepal, conducted a social audit gap analysis in 60 schools in three districts to understand the gaps in conduct of social audits in schools against the Government of Nepal's Social Audit Guidelines. Although about 83% of community schools conducted social audits in the academic year 2008/09, the pilot found that the implementation of social audits varied between the three districts. Gaps in implementation were mainly due to poor capacity and lack of information at the community-level to fully understand their responsibilities.

# Score Cards for Service: Impact Evaluation of the Burkina Faso Community Monitoring for Better Health and Education Service Delivery Project on July 10

The Burkina Faso Community Monitoring for Better Health and Education Service Delivery Project (CMP) aims to increase the quality and quantity of health and education services through empowering and capacitating individuals and communities to demand good governance and through increasing transparency and accountability of service providers. This is achieved through a community scorecard mechanism through which communities evaluate the quality of services in health and education facilities. The CMP includes an experimental IE component to evaluate the *causal impact* of the project on key outcomes, including social capital. In this seminar, the research team presented the IE study design, baseline results, operational implications, and future research directions.
