Historical Overview

- Critical number of fatalities in road accidents in 2008
- Each responsible agency acting without coordination
- National Road Safety Strategy 2010-2013
 - First organized step and its positive effects
- New challenges emerge



National Road Safety Strategy

Elaboration of National Road Safety Strategy: 2013 - 2015

Long-term Road Safety Goal: “Towards roads and traffic which are eventually free from death and serious injury”

Financial source: World Bank, In the framework of Fourth East West Highway Improvement Project (EWHIP-IV)

Beneficiary agencies: 6 ministries/agencies

Approval of the strategy: by the Government decree №1389 on July 11, 2016

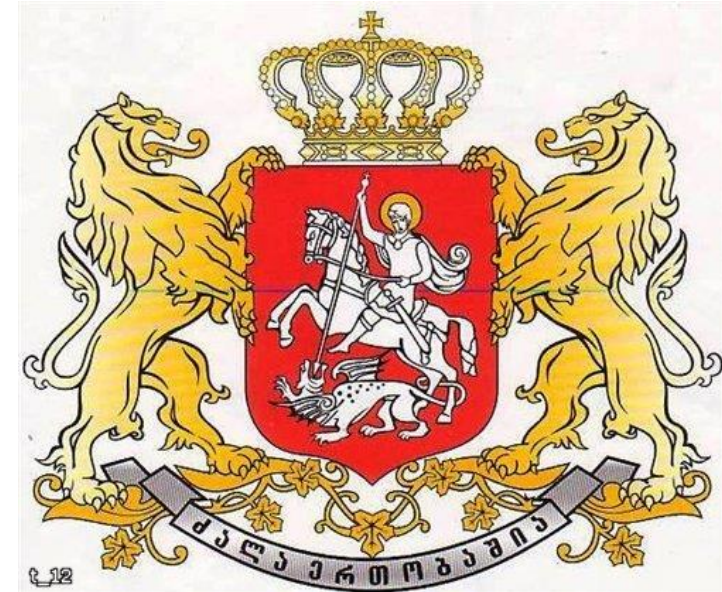
- Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development of Georgia was defined as a Lead Agency
- Creation of Road Safety **Inter-Agency Commission** and **National Road Safety Working Group**
- Elaboration of the Action Plans

The Interagency Commission and Working Group

- The Commission & Working Group
 - Composition
 - Main objectives and functions
 - Accountability – Working Group to Commission and Commission to Government
 - The Commission meetings are held at least once in quarter and Working Group meetings – each month

➤ 2017 Road Safety Action Plan:

- 8 objectives
- 27 activities
- Projected Budget: 153,575,220 GEL

➤ 2018 Road Safety Action Plan:

- 13 objectives
- 29 activities
- Projected budget: 106,825,281 GEL

Main Problems and Challenges

- Lack of measurable indicators in the Action Plan
- Not enough involvement on a vertical level
- Insufficient human recourse in the lead agency
- Too many objectives in the action plan
