- We are looking for a limited number of **HIGHLY EFFECTIVE** actions that we can collectively address

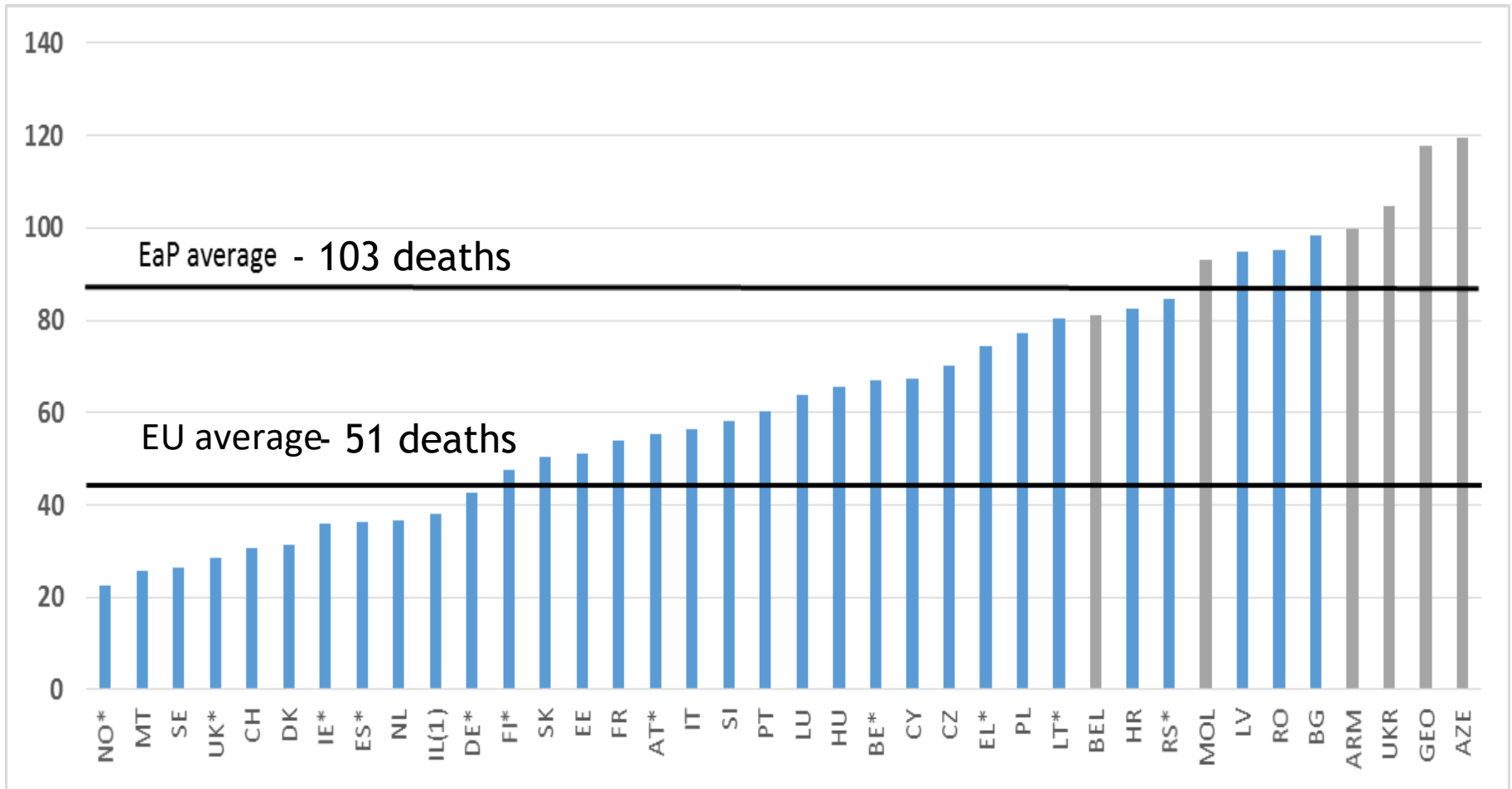


What are the objectives for the workshop?
