# COVID-19 financing principles

I. Financing is provided for 3 new (beyond regular BP) service packages related to COVID-19:



**Inpatient care for patients with COVID-19**



**Emergency medical care for patients with COVID-19**



**Mobile crews designed to respond to COVID-19**

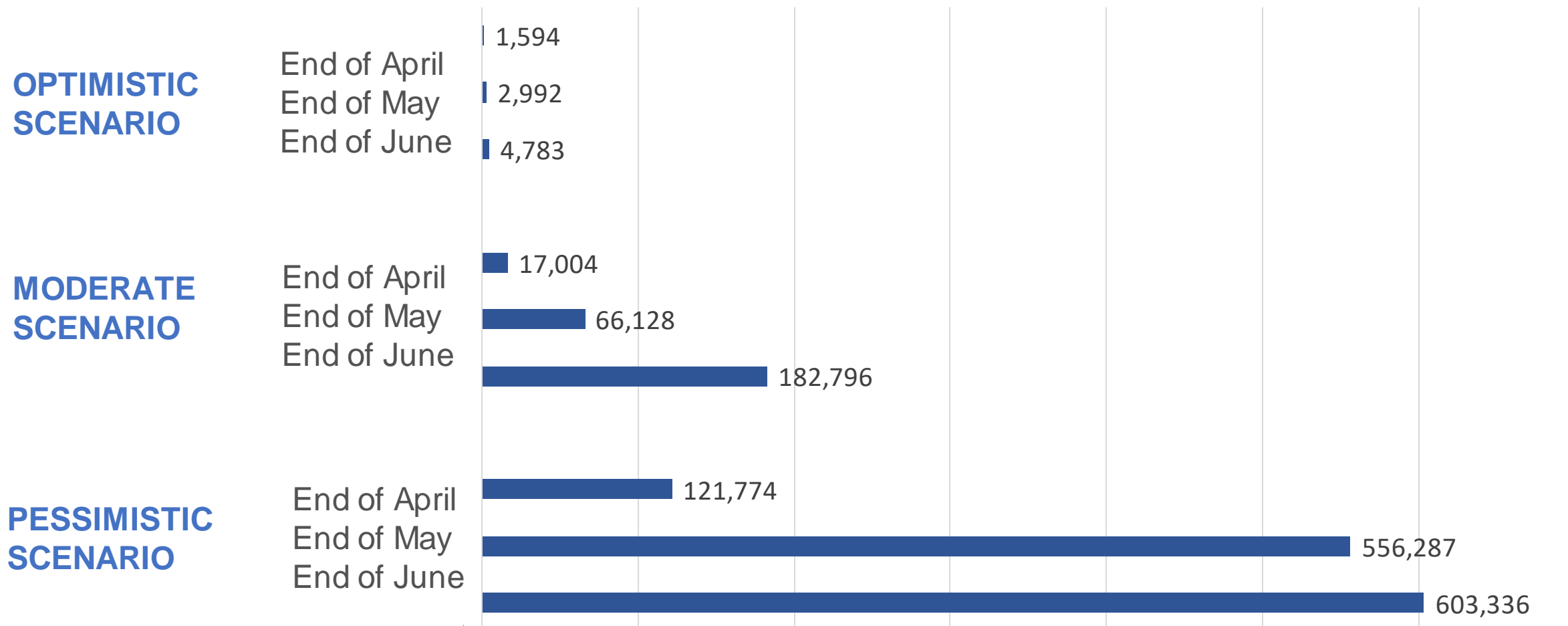
II. Fee is related to the READINESS OF FACILITIES TO PROVIDE services to patients with COVID-19 (rather than actually provided services). It allows to control the rising cost with a significant increase of the number of patients.

III. Fee includes 300% salary increase for professionals involved in care provision and additional provision of medicines and medical supplies.

IV. Personal protective equipment, test systems, expensive medicine, capex is not included (financed separately by the Ministry of Health).

# Financing proposal is based on epidemiological forecast

## Inpatient care for patients with COVID-19

### WHO PROVIDES SERVICES?

The facilities identified by the Ministry of Health for hospitalization of patients with COVID-19 (242 facilities in Ukraine)

### HOW DO WE PAY?

- According to the number of ventilators for medicines for ICU patients
- According to the number of teams of doctors working in the facility with patients with COVID-19 (1 team = 20 people (1 anesthesiologist, 4 therapists / infectious disease specialists, nurses, paramedical staff – fixed fee per month per one team
- +cost of medicines for patients who don't need ventilators



## Mobile crews designed to respond to COVID-19

### WHO PROVIDES SERVICES?

Mobile crews have been set up to test patients with COVID-19 at home (currently 1600 crews are created per 37 mln patients)

### HOW DO WE PAY?

According to the number of crews that conduct at least 150 tests per month. The crews only collect material. PCR is done by laboratories financed under a separate budget.

### Tariff type:

Global budget paid based on the number of crews in the facility .  
1 team = fixe fee per month (if the team conducts less than 150 tests, a reduction factor is applied.)



## Emergency medical care for patients with COVID-19

### WHO PROVIDES SERVICES?

Emergency medical centers (25 facilities)

### HOW DO WE PAY?

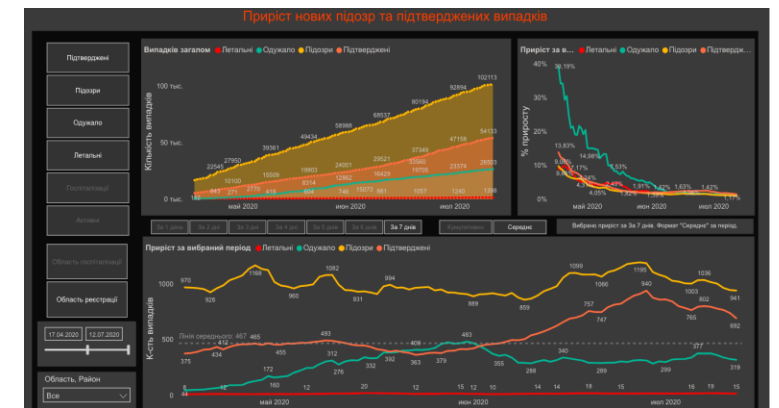
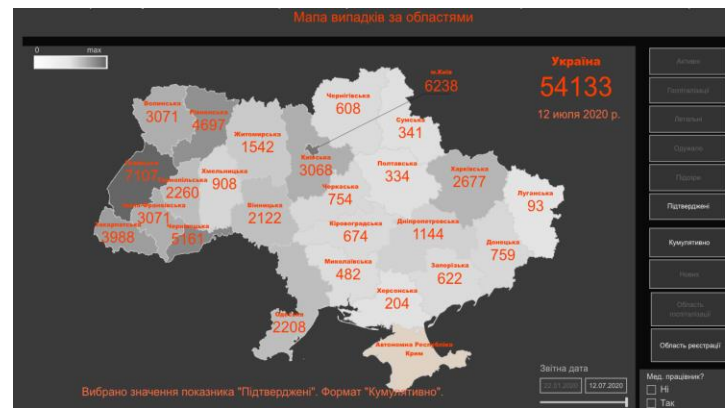
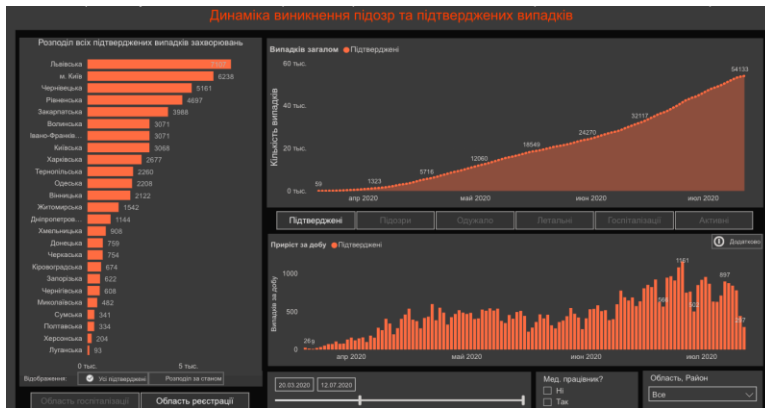
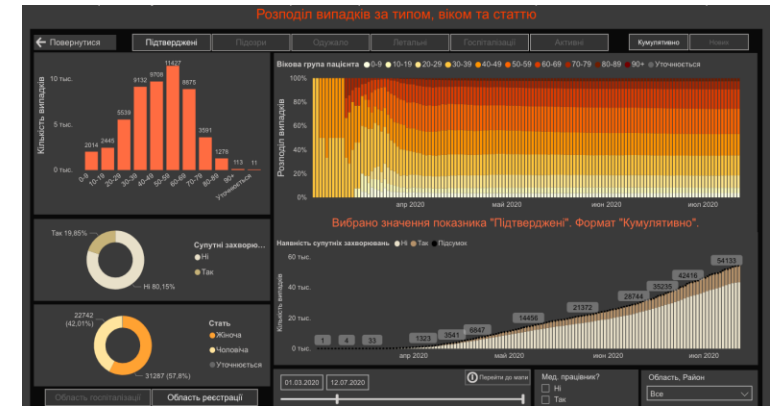
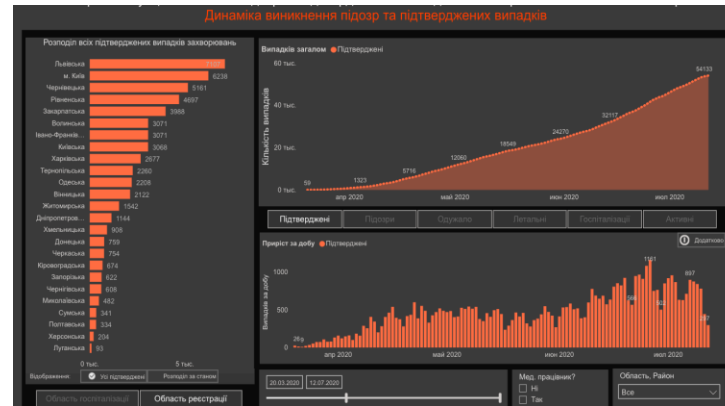
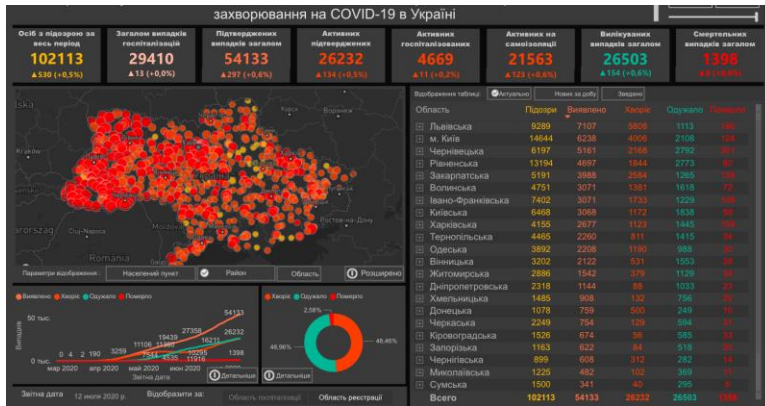
According to the number of patients in the region (taking into account the additional demand for visits to patients with COVID-19 and telephone consultations)

### Tariff type:

The global budget calculated on the basis of payment for 1 new patient in the region – fixed fee per patient

# Bangladesh Context

- A densely populated country: over a thousand people live per square kilometer and a population of over 160 million.
- GDP Per Capita: USD 1855.7
- Economy is mainly dependent on Revenue, Remittance and Export of readymade garments
- Out of pocket expenditure for a country like Bangladesh is 67%
- Bifurcated health system, governance and capacity gaps in health sector and lack of coordination between ministries/departments
- Stagnant MMR (196/100,000LB) and NMR (30/1,000LB) for about a decade
- The first Coronavirus case was detected on March 8, since then 186,894 confirmed cases with 2,391 deaths recorded (low testing capacity)
- Health Sector gets priority in the budget for 2020-21, hiked by 23.44% than the previous year, also block allocation of BDT 100 billion for emergency health crisis

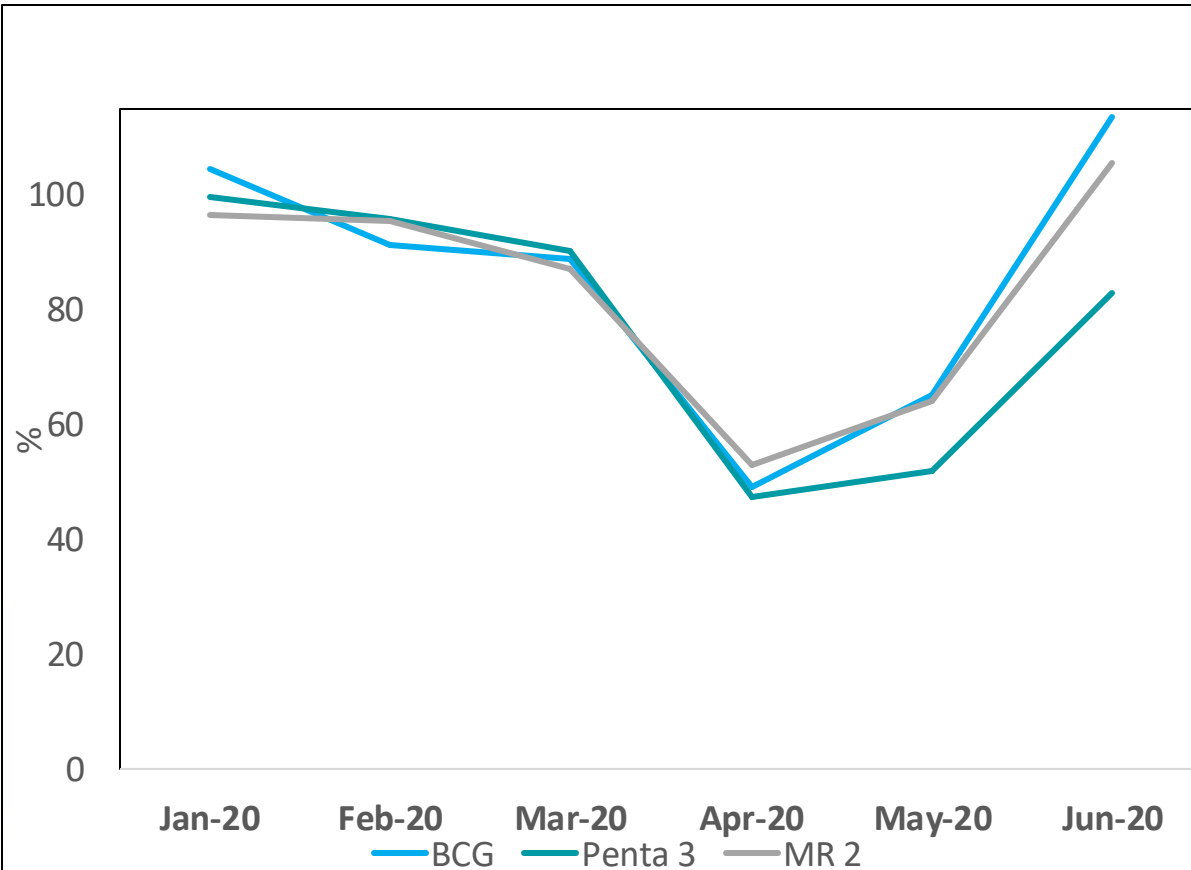

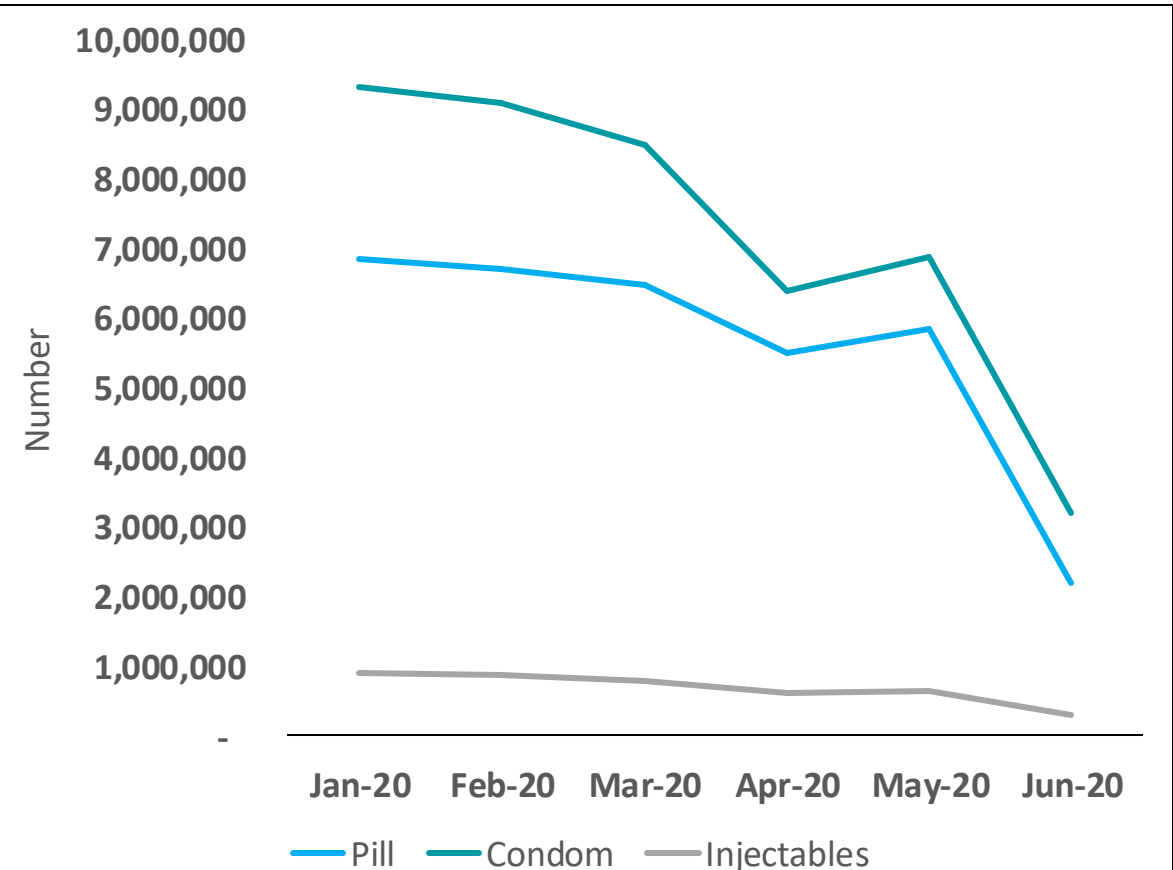

## Immunization by antigen

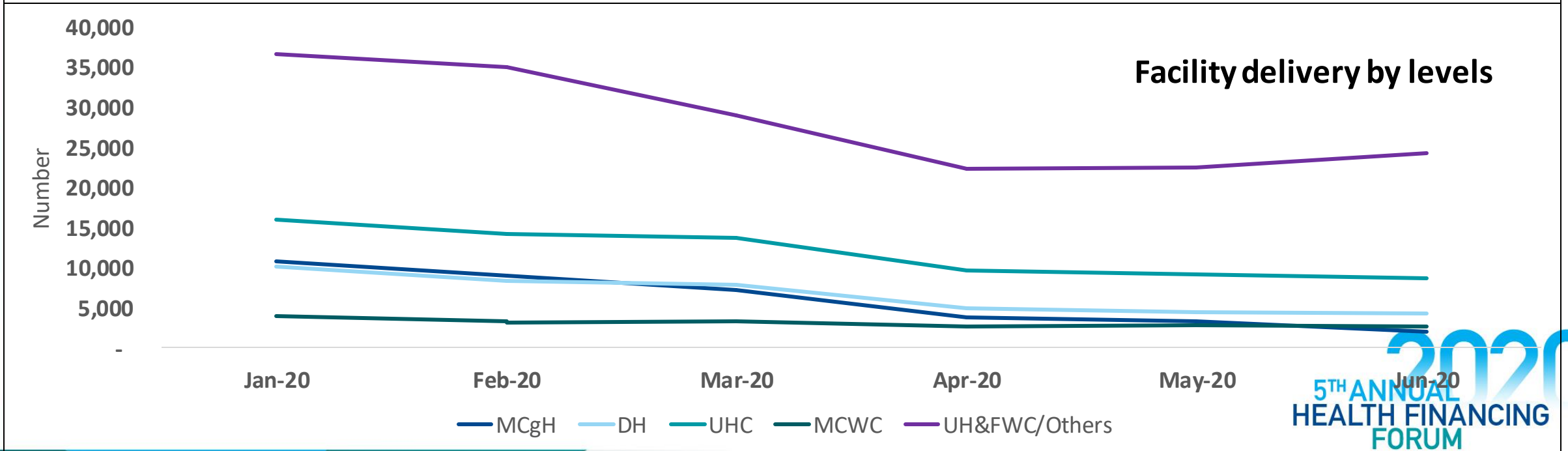
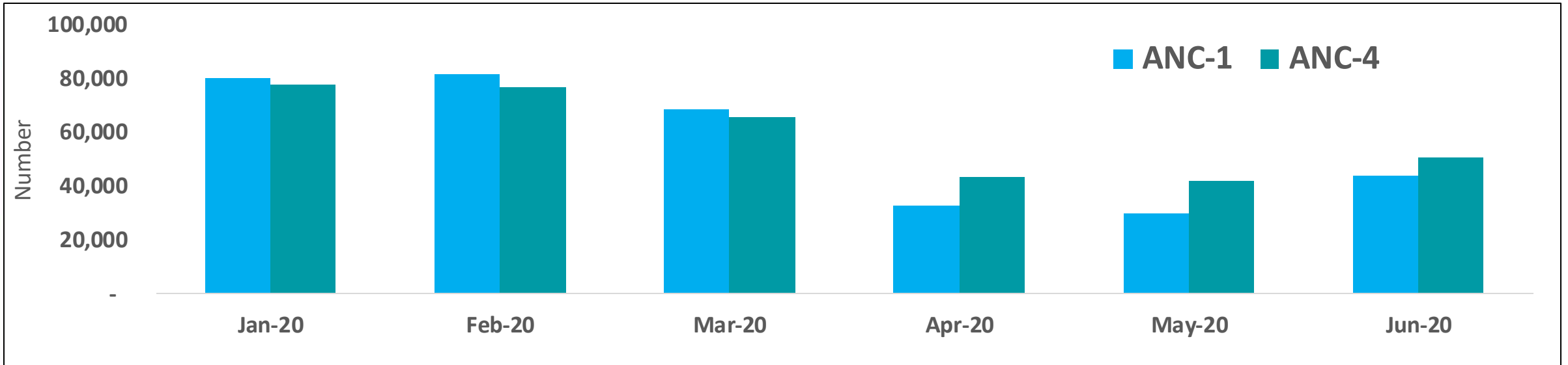

# Initiatives for continuing essential service delivery

- End of Public Holidays in June, government instructions for service continuation at all levels
- Collaboration with joint UN-DP-CSOs for TA support
- Guidelines developed on MNCH/FP/N service delivery in Covid19 context
- ICT based solutions for virtual training, meetings and monitoring
- Capacity building of HCPs at different levels
- Facility readiness for essential service delivery to Covid-19 patients
- Ensured personal protective measures/lump sum cash for service providers
- Establishment of handwashing station at all facilities
- Declaration of Health Compensation for Covid-19 infected doctors
- Targeted phone calls to build client's trust and confidence
- Resource mobilization through collaboration with local government bodies

# Building a resilient health system

- **Coordination** for long term strategy and well resourced preparedness plan considering a probable economic downturn
- **Equity** in resource allocation: (COVID/non-COVID; primary/tertiary levels)
- Institutionalization of **virtual platforms** and procedures
- Re-focus on **Essential Service Delivery**
- Uninterrupted **essential supplies**
- Investment in resilient health systems, with well-equipped and supported **health workers** (including CHWs)
- Fill-in **HR gaps** at all levels
- Improve **management capacity** of MOH managers (planning, information management and budget management)
- **Critical demand side barriers** – inclusion of community in decision making and coordination
