The public sector and purchasing arrangements for maternal health services during COVID-19

Private sector providers in Kampala

- Kampala has over 1600 health facilities
 - 98% of which are private for-profit and not-for-profit facilities, ranging from solo practices to large hospitals
 - Most correspond to HC-II/III level facilities or are drug shops/pharmacies
- The KCCA runs 8 PHC facilities
 - Overall, with public facilities at only 2%, it is important to maintain the public/private balance in service provision

KAMPALA CAPITAL CITY AUTHORITY

Public-private purchasing & engagement under KCCA

The KCCA seeks to enhance the coverage and quality of key maternal health services by engaging the private sector via:

- PHC block grants under MOUs to private health care providers
- Results-based financing for maternal health
- Branding and in-kind support to facilities to de-congest free public provision & optimize private use
- Quality assurance and improvement standards (SQIS+)

Challenges faced during COVID-19

Uganda took early and decisive action to control COVID cases, including transport lockdowns.

With highest impact in Kampala, private providers' ability to maintain services is affected by:

- Shortages of human resources and PPE
- Reduction in patient inflow & facility-based deliveries
- Inability to deliver maternal health services with high overhead costs

Causing rationalization and scalebacks in private MH provision

The KCCA is working to mitigate these challenges to effective purchasing and maintain the public/private balance

Maintaining & supporting private provision during COVID

- Set up the "Kampala Metropolitan Referral Working Group" to enhance public-private coordination and communication on load-sharing
- Started a call-center for transport service for patients to both public and private facilities
- Free ANC check-up's at private facilities for urban poor in slum areas (KCCA-PSI and 29 PFPs)
- Set up referral mechanisms and diverting emergency cases to public facilities
- Introduced home-care models for private facilities to take up

What has worked to maintain private services, including through public purchasing mechs?

Improved communication and coordination under the working group

Transport services to public and private facilities (~5,000 users in a short period, including MCH)

What are the challenges?

Private sector is still in survival mode and service provision is slowly recovering (e.g. HRH challenges)

Utilization of ANC, PNC, and facility-based services by the urban poor may still be down given lockdown measures
