





# Most countries will need to roll-out vaccination in stages – which means prioritizing who gets it first

#### WHY?

- Production scale-up takes time, particularly for the first effective vaccine(s)
- Different vaccines will be available at different times
- Safety approvals may be specific to certain populations
- Financing constraints also affect vaccine production and distribution

Target population groups in phase 1



Equity implications: who misses out in phase 1?



Reduce most urgent health needs: mortality and severe morbidity

People most at risk of immediate death or severe morbidity:

- Health care workers
- Elderly, people with comorbidities

Those most vulnerable to economic effects of pandemic

- Poor/near-poor
- Displaced people
- Disadvantaged groups (social or economic)

# **But which population group gets priority?**Depends on the objective of vaccine(s) distribution – all have implications for equity

Prime objective



Target population groups in phase 1



- 18-35 year olds
- People in crowded areas/refugee camps/urban slums
- High-risk workers (e.g., health, social and aged care workers, essential workers, police, etc.)
- Super-spreaders

Equity implications: who misses out in phase 1?

People most at risk of:

- Immediate death
- COVID-related unemployment
- Impoverishment/further impoverishment
- Non-COVID health needs (pregnant women, children)

## Reduce most urgent economic harm

- 3a.  $\downarrow$  impact on the economy

Service industry or agricultural workers

- Other critical industries
- People pushed into poverty or losing jobs
  - People who are already poor, informal workers, migrants, disadvantaged groups

## Practical issues in applying equity principles

**Vaccine characteristics** 



Type of vaccine, availability (date of likely safety approval), number of doses needed, cost, manufacturing capacity, cost, distribution and storage requirements, etc.

COVID-19 epidemiology (national & subnational)



Geographical burden of COVID-19; % of elderly by geographical region; demographics; distribution of the poor, risk-benefit analysis, etc.

**Health system characteristics** 



Data on health workers (public and private; all cadres?) and people with comorbidities; cold chain capacity and distribution facilities; benefits package; financing structure (has system removed financial barriers?); ability to reach mobile populations/displaced individuals; costs/benefits, etc.

**Demand-side barriers** 



Demand side barriers such as vaccine hesitancy, lack of trust, transportation costs to obtain vaccines, etc.

# Countries are at various stages of thinking about the prioritization process for within-country vaccination and their equity implications

- Given that vaccines are imminent, it is critical that distribution plans are finalized
- Guidance is available to countries (e.g., WHO/SAGE), but decisions should be owned by countries and adapted to local needs
- Many countries will try to balance multiple objectives; equity is important to consider
- We know from the past that process is important: involving multiple stakeholders and making decisions <u>explicit</u> will help with public acceptability and accountability
