


### STRATEGIC PLAN 2014-2019 OBJECTIVES












## **OVERALL WSTF FUNDING AND COVERAGE**

- Over **Ksh. 6 Billion** disbursed to both Urban and Rural projects to reach **4 million** people
- Ksh. 2.5 Billion has been disbursed to Urban projects to date covering 1.4 million people
- 191 Urban projects implemented
- Ksh. 3.8 Billion disbursed to the Rural projects covering 2.5 million people

#### **FURTHER IMPACT OF URBAN PROJECTS**

#### 1. National level

Development of national technical standards, access & coverage definition, pro-poor database (MajiData), pro-poor focus in the sector

#### 2. County/WSP level

Pro-poor focus, more connections, increased revenue, reduced UfW, development of capacities (e.g. financial management, procurement), improved working relations with local stakeholders (e.g. PHO, Chiefs), regular exchanges with other WSPs

#### 3. Area level

Communities working together, capacity building, improved public health situation, communities asking for higher service levels, reduced time for water fetching, reduced cost for water, sustainability

## **7<sup>TH</sup> CALL FOR PROPOSALS**

• The 7th CFP was launched on 28th Jan 2015 and will be closed on 31st March 2015. WSPs encouraged to apply based on criteria

#### • Purpose of the Funding

• Improvement and/or development of water and sanitation infrastructure in the low income urban areas.

#### • Funding Thresholds and Ceilings

- Water KES 5 20 million per project
- Sanitation KES 3 10 million per project

#### • Feed back Proposal writing workshops

- Kisumu and Mombasa on 10 11th Mar 2015
- Naivasha and Embu on 16 19th Mar 2015

#### **NEW URBAN PROGRAMMES:**

### **UBSUP 1**<sup>st</sup> call for proposals appraisal


The 1st CfP was made on 15th August 2014 - open for 60 days to 13<sup>th</sup> October 2014.


- 48 proposals had been form 40 WSPs and one youth group applied.
- 30 projects appraised
- 20 projects fully met the criteria will be signed on 10<sup>th</sup> March 2015
  - 11 have DTF and toilets components KES 14,989,013
  - 9 have toilets component only - KES 6,353,393
- 10 projects had different minor issues
  - Low population to guarantee subsequent phases- need for support by UBSUP team.

## RESULT BASED AID PROGRAMS

## 1. AoD - (Aid on Delivery) Concept

- AoD = Result-Based Aid
   (Grant/subsidy payable <u>AFTER</u>
   completion and achievement of output/outcome)
- Project pre-financed by WSP equity and loan.
- AoD Formula = 20% (WSP)/ 40% (Bank) 40% (WSTF)
- Funding from KfW







# 2. OBA- Output Based Aid

- The Grant and Subsidiary finacing agreements were signed in September and December 2014
- The programme is funded by World Bank and was officially launched in February 2015.
- Under the programme the WSP will pre-finance investments in household water connections, household sewer connections, public water kiosks, and public toilets through loans from local commercial banks.



## **OUTPUT BASED AID CONT'D**

- WSTF will subsidize 60% of project costs to low income urban areas upon attaining the deliverables.
- Programme includes financing for initial Technical Assistance costs
- In both Result Based Aid programmes, WSP should discuss with WSTF the viability of proposal to see if it meets subsidy criteria before applying for commercial loan
- WSTF will only subsidize for projects that meet the established criteria

- County Oversight
- County Resident Monitors
- Independent External Audits
- Enhanced M&E Framework
- Use of long term & short term Consultants
- Internal Spots checks by WSTF staff
- Internal Audits (financial & technical)



#### **LESSONS LEARNT**

- 1. Collaboration with County Government is key for success & sustainability of projects
- 2. Twenty (20) million people in the Counties still underserved
- 3. Conventional funding approaches not applicable for the poor (commercially unviable)
- 4. Sanitation totally ignored (County fact sheets provided)
- 5. Capacity development for implementing Partners is essential for success of programme activities
- 6. Transparency & accountability is key for partnerships
