



Integrated Urban Water Management Workshop in Indonesia

Agenda

Jakarta & Bogor, January 28 – February 1, 2019

Background

In September 2017, a delegation from Indonesia consisted of representatives from Bappenas, Ministry of Public Works and Housing, and Balikpapan Municipality, participated in a Technical Deep Dive (TDD) on Integrated Urban Water Management (IUWM) in Tokyo, Japan. The TDD was jointly organized and financed by the Social, Urban, Rural and Resilience (SURR) and Water Global Practices (GPs) of the World Bank. There were 15 country delegations participated in the TDD. During and shortly after this workshop, the Ethiopia, Ghana and Indonesia delegations expressed concrete interest in learning from international operational experiences. In response to this demand, the joint Water and SURR team mobilized funds from both the Global Water Security and Sanitation Partnership (GWSP) and the South-South Facility (SSF) to organize a series of South-South Knowledge Exchange (SSKE) activities.

Ethiopia, Ghana and Indonesia face severe urban water challenges, which are interlinked, urgent and complex, dealing with several (sub-) sectors and public and private stakeholders. While these countries each have a set of unique local characteristics and issues, they face several common challenges, such as the impacts of rapid urbanization (often in informal settlements) and overall underinvestment in infrastructure combined with the uncoordinated urban planning, land use changes that have deteriorated water quality and depleted aquifers, increased disaster risks due to climate change, and limited implementation capacity at local levels.

In June 2018, delegations from the three countries visited Brazil for a knowledge exchange event, aiming to learn from operational examples in São Paulo and Teresina as well as from each other's experiences. These examples showed how integration beyond the traditional borders between sectors (spread over multiple projects and decades in the São Paulo metropolitan area, and within one project in Teresina) can lead to significant additional benefits for urban inhabitants. Following up on this event, the World Bank is supporting the three countries in organizing national workshops to assist the governments towards implementation of more integrated solutions to their urban water challenges.

The first of these national workshops is scheduled to take place in Indonesia from January 28 to February 1, 2019. The workshop will be divided in two parts: firstly, a two-day high-level workshop in Jakarta, followed by a three-day technical workshop in Bogor for city delegations. BAPPENAS and the Ministry of Public Works and Housing lead the organization of the workshop, in collaboration with the Association of Indonesia Municipalities (APEKSI – *Asosiasi Pemerintah Kota Seluruh Indonesia*). DKI Jakarta and seven municipalities (Bogor, Tangerang, Balikpapan, Semarang, Banjarmasin, Surabaya, and Palembang) will be invited to participate in this workshop.

The proposed agenda below responds to Indonesia’s priorities and aims to inform the national and city level initiatives and project portfolios related to IUWM. The workshop will tailor learnings and discussions to Indonesia’s specific challenges and focus on the application of integrated principles in development projects and planning processes, such as the mid-term national development plans that will be drafted in 2019. Workshop sessions will include discussion with governor and mayors, presentations from international experts from the World Bank, JICA, and USAID, as well as site visits and interactive activities, leading to development of action plan for each city.
