Karachi, Pakistan Accomplishments Needed



- 1. 100% collection and safe disposal.
- 2. Eventual reduction in waste generation by reuse and recycling
- 3. Massive general awareness program & promotion of community participation in SWM
- 4. Mobilization of private financing & operations in sector
- 5. Institutional capacity & modern data techniques, for contract management, service management, performance tracking and enforcement





Karachi, Pakistan Actions to be Taken



Short-term:

- SWM master planning. 2 years
- Waste characterization & recovery study. 1 year
- Data system for Service Management, Performance Monitoring. 2 years
- program for community awareness / mobilization with NGOs / social workers. 2 years

Medium-term:

- Feasibility / appraisal for waste-to-energy / incineration to determine suitability. 2 years
- Enforcing user fees or other system of cost recovery. 2 years
- Program for mainstreaming of informal waste-picking + recycling. 2 years
- Enabling framework to promote private financing. 3 year

• Long-term:

Developing of 2-3 sanitary landfill sites. 5-7 years





Karachi, Pakistan - Barriers & Challenges to Implementation



- 1. Lack of expertise/ Capacity issues.
- 2. Public behavior and lack of civic sense.
- 3. Financial constraints.
- 4. Shortfall of work force due to socio economic issues.
- 5. Authentic data availability.









Technical Assistance Work Planned:

- WB conducting rapid technical assessment + action roadmap for sector.
- Further studies are expected to provide a way forward for final treatment and disposal.

Investment Work Planned:

- 1. US\$50 Million Amount kept by Provincial Govt as Aid to Local Govt. for routine collection in practice.
- 2. US\$200 Million for establishment of 6 Nos.
 GTS









Karachi, Pakistan - Support Needed



World Bank:

- Financial & technical assistance for Master Plan and various feasibility studies.
- Programmatic Financial support covering social mobilization, recycling systems, & physical infrastructure (landfill + GTS)

• TDLC Program (Japan)

- Operational expertise required in the following:
 - designing of landfill and GTS sites.
 - conducting social / community awareness and mobilization, behavior change of community
 - conducting feasibility / appraisal for waste-to-energy / incineration to determine its suitability
 - designing recycling system and value chain for organic, plastic and other types of waste
