TANZANIA – ACCOMPLISHMENTS NEEDED

- The need of central government to subsidize SWM activities (O & M) costs.
- The importance of Community Engagement and education in Solid wastes management.
- The Importance of the capacity building in emerging technologies on SWM

TANZANIA – ACTION TO BE TAKEN

Short-term:

- Integrated coordination among various stakeholders by GoZ/ ZUMC within 6months.
- Enforcement of law and regulations pertain to solid waste management (GOZ; 6 months).

Medium-term:

 Persistently Community meeting on best practice and knowledge sharing of recycling and collection of household wastes (GOZ; 6-12months).

Long-term:

Explore new efficient & emerging technology (LT; 2-5 years)

Barriers & Challenges to Implementation

- Coordinate and synchronize the various actors engaging in community sensitization/ education related to behavior change campaign in <u>solid wastes</u> <u>practice bylaws</u>, <u>regulations</u>, <u>willingness to pay</u> <u>for service</u> etc
- To develop <u>policy and indicative action plan</u> for integrated SWM;
- To engage <u>private sector</u> on planning, management and coordination of SWM.

Lending and TA – Activities currently active or needed

- Technical Assistance Work Planned:
 - SWM capacity building (training/ workshop)
 - Developing policy and indicative action plan for SWM
- Investment Work Planned:
 - Institutional strengthening needed
 - SW equipment's under procurement ZUSP.

 To pilot resources recycle organic waste, composting technology;

TDLC PROGRAM

- Set up sub-Saharan Africa TDLC SWM Alumni for knowledge exchange and capacity building (peer-to-peer TDD study tours).
- Engage Expert from TDLC for (i) SWM capacity building (training/ workshop); and (ii) Best practice in Operation and Management Plans (OMPs) for ZUMC and GOZ staffs.
